Silver Sky and Silver Sky at Deer Springs work closely with clinical partner, so each property can provide residents with additional support on a daily basis. This month, we are highlighting our longtime clinical partner, **CareMore**.

CareMore is an onsite Medicare Advantage program available to seniors over the age of 65-years-old who reside in a licensed setting, such as a group homes, assisted livings, HIRC homes, or a nursing homes. CareMore provides nurse practitioners and medical assistants to properties, so they may serve residents who have additional medical needs or concerns.



At Silver Sky at Deer Springs, CareMore's onsite Nurse Practitioner is April Kice, who has served Silver Sky and Silver Sky at Deer Springs collectively for five years, and Medical Assistant Cathy Miguel, who also serves the residents at Deer Springs. We sat down with April to learn more about her and hear her story.



Let's get to know April:

Born and raised in Appleton, Wisconsin, a young April first began her journey within the medical field, at the age of 17, after she joined the Army as a medic. Seeking adventure while helping others was the catalyst to spark her passion for health. Through the Armed forces, she was able to gain a scholarship for nursing school which she used for her RN at Wright State University. She would eventually return to the Army as a nurse, doing emergency trauma in the ICU until 2009. In 2012, after she completed her master's in nursing, she became a nurse practitioner, stating "Nursing school is hard and time-consuming, but in the end, it's

worth it." April is now a nurse practitioner with Caremore and has two kids, Ethan and Elyanna, from her loving husband Richard, who is part of the Air Force. She and her coworker Cathy, a medical assistant at Caremore, both tend to patients daily at Deer Springs. They both enjoying working for CareMore, as it's a company that focuses more on the quality of care versus the quantity. "I love working with families and people," she states, "You can learn more from your patients than you are able to teach them."

We love having April and Cathy in our communities as CareMore helps our residents feel safe and healthy in their homes.







Throughout her lifetime she was able to witness the evolution of computer technology as it progressed from a






Kengo Uda is a man who enjoys fishing, music, and singing. As a young man, Kengo joined the military after North Korea invaded South Korea's borders in June of 1950, sparking the Korean War. "It was either volunteer or get drafted," he stated. Through his bravery, he was able to face those "not so happy times," as he puts it. While patrolling, Kengo says he would hear, "Hit the deck!" shouted during times of battle. As ammunition rained down on his company, Kengo and his fellow companions would eventually

rise only to find others did not. Covered in his dear friend's blood, Kengo held him close while shedding tears of deep sorrow. After the war ended, he traveled back to Hawaii, where he began working the sugar cane fields and pineapple cannery. At one point in time, he found himself working for an atomic bomb testing site, where he witnessed amazing, yet deadly explosions.

After traveling to places like Japan and Mexico, Kengo made his way to Las Vegas where he would meet his future wife, Geri. He first saw her at a bowling alley while she was attending a company event and asked her out on a date. After some time, he brought her back to the Hawaiian Islands where they married; they were married for 53 years. They ended up having two daughters named Jennifer and Melissa. It has been three years since Kengo's wife passed away, but he always keeps her in his heart. "You never really get over it," he states. "You still miss them every day."
